
There's a new game in town.

The share the wealth draw of \$120 was shared by Ted White, Marnie Henry and the third person I have forgotten already. I guess I have lost more than my hair.












Bingo - Monday March 18th at 7PM

Display Case

Rocks and Minerals

Time marches on and it is now time to remove my collection of sheep from the display case. I love sheep. There is just something so endearing about them. At one time, I had pondered the idea of owning a sheep farm. Reconsidered once I realized that they are quite odiferous.

Originally, for February, Chris Rynberk (129 Bristlecone Court) was going to show us some samples of his rock and mineral collection. But he wasn't quite ready. It can be a lot of work preparing to exhibit. Lucky for us, he is now ready.

In the meantime, while talking with Howard Coates (16 Pine Ridge Road), Chris learned that he has been a geologist for the past 50 years.

Chris says that he has always had a keen interest in the world around him and chose to study geography and geology in secondary school and university. He loved earth sciences in order to discover what made the world go round.

After graduating from Brock University and the University of Toronto, he became a teacher and taught secondary school. He spent many years on field trips with students whenever he could to introduce them to "hands on learning".

Over the years he collected many rocks and minerals as a hobby. Most of these have now been donated to the school he left when he entered administration.

The display case for March includes some great examples of petrified wood and other memorabilia. The wood/stone sample came from the Petrified Forest National Park in northeastern Arizona, but he did not pick it up as that is illegal. It was given to him by a dear neighbour in 1990 who got it there in the 1930s perhaps before it was illegal to pick up samples.

While attending Memorial University, Howard spent his summers working in mineral exploration in Newfoundland and Nova Scotia and geological mapping with the Saskatchewan Geological Survey.

After graduating from Memorial University, with a M.Sc. in geology, Howard whisked his new bride off to Western Australia. He worked for Falconbridge Nickel Mines exploring for nickel-copper deposits for 5 years and then was transferred to Manitoba. After moving to Fredericton, he worked for Billiton on tin-tungsten-molybdenum and lead-zinc silver projects in the Maritimes. He was transferred to Toronto in 1983 and has since worked as an Associate Geological Consultant and lastly as Vice President Exploration for Mnsud Resources Corp, based in Buenos-Aires, Argentina. Throughout his career, Howard has had the opportunity to travel extensively in Canada and abroad.

So, Chris and Howard are going to combine their collections for one super display. Apparently, there is more to rocks than meets the eye.
