

You can't fool all the people all the time, but it isn't necessary.

Over the last several weeks and months, I've been hearing from a number of residents with concerns about scam calls, suspected scam email or text messages. Along with some suspect sales tactics there seem to be more of these going on than there were. I know almost every day I get emails. phone calls, voice mails, texts and advertising through social media, telling me that I need to take action, pay attention or respond urgently or face some financial loss, miss a great deal or experience some imminent disaster. I get emails or Facebook posts from friends warning me not to accept friend



requests from them because they've been 'hacked.' This time of year, I expect we'll soon be seeing people offering faster tax returns, or sketchy charitable causes. Are you getting these too?

There was a time when these phony contacts were easy to spot, and usually involved really hard to believe stories or requests. Remember the Nigerian prince willing to give you millions just to let him deposit money in your bank account? That was the early days of 'Phishing.' - using emails to lure you into sharing information that would allow others to take advantage of you. Pretty transparent...BUT...they've gotten better! Now they might ask you to click on a pretty official looking link or go to a website with a legitimate sounding request. Maybe your Amazon account has a suspect charge on it, or your Visa has been compromised, or a UPS shipment has been held up at the border. All asking you to respond to fix the issue. There's a variation on Phishing called 'Spear Phishing.' That's a targeted email with specific information on you that makes it look more legitimate. A concern with your VISA card with the numbers 4538 for example.

Or how about 'Vishing?' That's phone calls and can be anything from outright fraud, asking for your bank information to merely sketchy sales practices – Duct cleaning anyone? How about furnace inspections, water heater treatment or maintenance work Anybody else getting voicemail messages entirely in Chinese? Not enough?

Seen any 'Smishing?' That's text messaging. Don't know about you, but I get something almost every day. Credit card inquiries, banking issues, Amazon, NetFlix, freight companies needing confirmation of a delivery. They look increasingly realistic; just like the real thing. That's the sad, and scary, part. They look just like the real thing.

Why do these people perpetuate these truly deplorable practices? **BECAUSE THEY WORK!** The contacts are sent out by the thousands, and it only takes an inattentive moment, a simple mouse click, or agreeing to a visitor to your home, and you could be swept up in the net!

What should you do if you've received a suspicious phone call, text message or email from someone?

Do **NOT** respond to the request for information. If it sounds legitimate to you, contact the provider directly. Contact them at *their* phone number or email address, *NOT* the one in the message! Ask them if there are any issues, opportunities, or questions with your account. Talk to a neighbour or friend. Often, you'll

find they have had a similar experience, maybe the same experience! You may want to report the incident to the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre:

However, a review of the Maintenance Cost Report for the month of February 2024 shows that some one-time projects costs for the Recreation Centre, including the purchase of new tables, a fibre installation to upgrade the Internet in the Recreation Centre and the new air conditioning unit and ducting for the Grand Hall, resulted in pushing our costs above our monthly fee again.

During the final weeks of March, you may have witnessed large flocks of male robins grouped mainly in and around our ornamental crabapple trees. An unusual sight we haven't seen in past springs.



In the vibrant season of spring, groups of male robins can be observed engaging in communal feeding rituals. These birds, known for their distinctive red breasts, often gather in numbers to forage for food as the ground thaws. When food is scarce, they form larger groups and share the bounty of crabapple trees, often found in residential areas or parks. This communal feeding can help them conserve energy and stay warm but also plays a crucial role in establishing social hierarchies before the breeding season commences.
