#### **Carbon Monoxide (CO) Detectors**

All home owners are required by law to have a CO (carbon monoxide) detector installed and functioning, adjacent to all sleeping areas in buildings that contain ...an attached garage (used to store or park vehicles. The attached garage must share a common wall, floor or ceiling with the home.

As well, a CO detector is required if there is a fireplace (either wood burning or propane).
