

CEGG is a teaching guild open to those interested in traditional and contemporary forms of embroidery. They aim to refine needlework skills, promote members' creativity, and extend awareness of embroidery in the community.

CEGG is quite unique in that it is one of the only teaching guilds in Canada. Meetings are held biweekly during the fall and winter. Registration is held in early September. There is a slate of 5 or 6 different classes to choose from, beginner to advanced.

Meetings are held at the Kortright Presbyterian Church in Guelph. A typical day starts with an information meeting at 9:30. Then everyone goes to their classroom until noon. After lunch there is either a speaker or a small project workshop.



# Life of a Cecropia Moth / What we found in our backyard by Bonnie Norris

Spotting this unusual 3 in. caterpillar (teal blue) we were able to capture its life cycle with photos.

This moth in the silk worm family is the largest in North America growing up to 7 plus inches.

Interesting fact: The Cecropia has no digestive system and the adults live approximately 10 days.

The colour and size caught my attention in the fall.



The cocoon was spun on a garden hose and the female moth emerged June 8<sup>th</sup>.



Immediately the female released hormones through her antennae to attract a male. He appeared the next day.



The pair were gone the following day. We cut the cocoon open and found a thick silk lining.
