Maintenance Cost Review Committee (MCRC)

The Maintenance Cost Review Committee met in October and reviewed the Maintenance Report for September. In the absence of a Board MCRC representative, PMHA President Chuck McCormack joined our meeting. Currently, there are no major projects ongoing.

The Lawn Maintenance and Beds Maintenance expenses were higher than last year as weekly grass cutting continued during September. We are now into the fall cleanup time, and it is expected the Lawn and Beds Maintenance will not be lower.

The bathrooms in the hall have been painted.

The Committee reviewed the Water and Sewer costs over the past 4 months and calculated our costs per home have come in lower than in some Municipalities. As our overall expenses were lower for September, our Maintenance fee to date is in a **positive** position of \$85.91!

The Maintenance Cost Report for September 2025 has been posted in the Boardroom for you to review. It has also been posted on the Pine Meadows Homeowners Association (PMHA) website. This report is prepared by the Management of Pine Meadows Retirement Community Limited (PMRC) and shows all Revenue items, Expense items, costs per home, and other important details.
